each month, may advance to other affected local public agencies located within its jurisdiction (i.e., school districts, special districts, cities, etc.) an amount not to exceed one-twelfth of the annual allocations, reimbursements, or subventions required for the delivery of services pursuant to related state and federal laws.

(f) This section does not apply to the State Department of Social Services.

## CHAPTER 423

An act to amend Section 2097 of the Fish and Game Code, relating to endangered and threatened species.

[Approved by Governor September 13, 1989. Filed with Secretary of State September 13, 1989.]

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 2097 of the Fish and Game Code is amended to read:

2097. This article shall remain in effect only until January 1, 1994, and as of that date is repealed, unless a later enacted statute, which is chaptered before January 1, 1994, deletes or extends that date.

## CHAPTER 424

An act to add Section 68077 to the Education Code, relating to postsecondary education.

[Approved by Governor September 13, 1989. Filed with Secretary of State September 13, 1989.]

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 68077 is added to the Education Code, to read:

68077. (a) Notwithstanding Section 68062, a student who is a graduate of any school located in California that is operated by the United States Bureau of Indian Affairs, including, but not limited to, the Sherman Indian High School, shall be entitled to resident classification. This exception shall continue so long as continuous attendance is maintained by the student at an institution.

(b) No provision of this section shall apply to the University of California unless the Regents of the University of Calfornia adopt a resolution to that effect.

SEC. 2. Notwithstanding Section 17610 of the Government Code, if the Commission on State Mandates determines that this act

contains costs mandated by the state, reimbursement to local agencies and school districts for those costs shall be made pursuant to Part 7 (commencing with Section 17500) of Division 4 of Title 2 of the Government Code. If the statewide cost of the claim for reimbursement does not exceed one million dollars (\$1,000,000), reimbursement shall be made from the State Mandates Claims Fund. Notwithstanding Section 17580 of the Government Code, unless otherwise specified in this act, the provisions of this act shall become operative on the same date that the act takes effect pursuant to the California Constitution.

## CHAPTER 425

An act to add Section 2064.2 to the Business and Professions Code, relating to the practice of medicine.

[Approved by Governor September 13, 1989. Filed with Secretary of State September 13, 1989.]

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 2064.2 is added to the Business and Professions Code, to read:

2064.2. No medical school or clinical training program shall deny access to elective clerkships or preceptorships in any medical school or clinical training program in this state solely on the basis that a student is enrolled in an osteopathic medical school.

Any violation of this section or Section 2064.1 may be enjoined in an action brought in the name of the people of the State of California by the district attorney of the county in which the violation occurs, upon receipt of a complaint by an aggrieved student.

## CHAPTER 426

An act to add Section 21339.1 to the Government Code, relating to the Public Employees' Retirement System.

[Approved by Governor September 13, 1989. Filed with Secretary of State September 13, 1989.]

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. It is the intent of the Legislature that this act not impact employer contribution rates.

SEC. 2. Section 21339.1 is added to the Government Code, to read:

21339.1. A member who elected to receive optional settlement 2
